### EASTER CINEMA! KUNG FU PANDA 4 (PG)



### DUNE: PART TWO (12A)

Dune: Part Two, directed by Denis Villeneuve, delves into the gripping second half of Frank Herbert's iconic novel, as Paul Atreides, portrayed by Timothée Chalamet, navigates the treacherous landscape of power and rebellion. United with Chani and the Fremen, Paul seeks revenge for the destruction of House Atreides. With a stellar ensemble cast including newcomers Austin Butler & Florence Pugh, Dune: Part Two promises an enthralling continuation of the Sci-Fi adventure.



### FRIGHT NIGHT: VIDEODROME (18)

Hailed by his contemporaries John Carpenter ("he's better than all of us combined!") and Martin Scorsese ("no one makes films like he does") as a genius, Videodrome was David Cronenberg's most mature work to date and still stands as one of his greatest.

Combining the bio-horror elements of his earlier films whilst anticipating the technological themes of his later work, Videodrome exemplifies Cronenberg's extraordinary talent for making both visceral and cerebral cinema. NOT to be missed on the big screen!



### AN ANGEL AT MY TABLE (15)

Jane Campion brings to the screen the harrowing true-life story of Janet Frame, New Zealand's most distinguished author. The film follows Frame along her inspiring journey, from a poverty-stricken childhood to a misdiagnosis of schizophrenia and electroshock therapy, to finally, international literary fame. Beautifully capturing the colour and power of the New Zealand landscape, the film earned Campion a sweep of her country's film awards and the Special Jury Prize at the Venice Film Festival.




### COPA 71 (PG)

Told by the pioneering women who participated in it and built from archive unseen for fifty years, this is the extraordinary story of the 1971 Women's Soccer World Cup, a tournament witnessed by record crowds that has been written out of sporting history – until now.

### ROBOT DREAMS (PG)

Based on the popular graphic novel by the North American writer Sara Varon, ROBOT DREAMS tells the adventures and misfortunes of Dog and Robot in NYC during the '80s. Dog lives in Manhattan and he's tired of being alone, so one day he decides to build himself a companion, Robot. Their friendship blossoms, and they become inseparable, together exploring the sights and sounds of 1980s New York. But one summer night, Dog, with great sadness, is forced to abandon Robot at the beach. Will they ever meet again?



### DRIVE-AWAY DOLLS (15)


Drive-Away Dolls is a riotous road trip comedy penned by Ethan Coen and Tricia Cooke. The film follows Jamie, a free-spirited woman reeling from a breakup, and her reserved friend Marian, who craves excitement. Their impromptu journey to Tallahassee takes a wild turn when they accidentally steal a car filled with contraband, leading them to cross paths with a group of hapless criminals.



### 20 DAYS IN MARIUPOL (18)

Winner of Best Documentary Feature Film at the 2024 Academy Awards.

In this vivid and harrowing account of life under siege, Mstyslav Chernov and other Ukrainian journalists try to fulfil their mission to capture what later become defining images of the atrocities of the 2022 Russian invasion. Told here with a clarity that is chilling, the film presents the horror of what took place, along with an account of the trauma experienced by those whose job it is to witness their country in turmoil.



### RED ISLAND (12A)

A visually dazzling, emotionally affecting autobiographical drama from celebrated auteur Robin Campillo (120 BPM). At the beginning of the 70s, in Madagascar, a few armed forces and their families live in one of the last French military bases abroad, a relic of the ending French colonial empire. Influenced by his reading of the intrepid comic book heroine Fantômette, Thomas, a ten-year-old boy, sweeps with a curious glance what surrounds him. Beneath the carefree expatriate life, his eyes are gradually opening to another reality.



### ROYAL BALLET: MACMILLAN CELEBRATED

Danses Concertantes, commissioned by Ninette de Valois in 1955, was MacMillan's first major work. An early sign of the incredible artistic output that would follow, the work's critical success spurred MacMillan to abandon performing in favour of choreography.

The mixed programme concludes with Requiem, his 1976 work for Stuttgart Ballet, created in memory of its late artistic director, MacMillan's friend and former Royal Ballet dancer and choreographer John Cranko.
