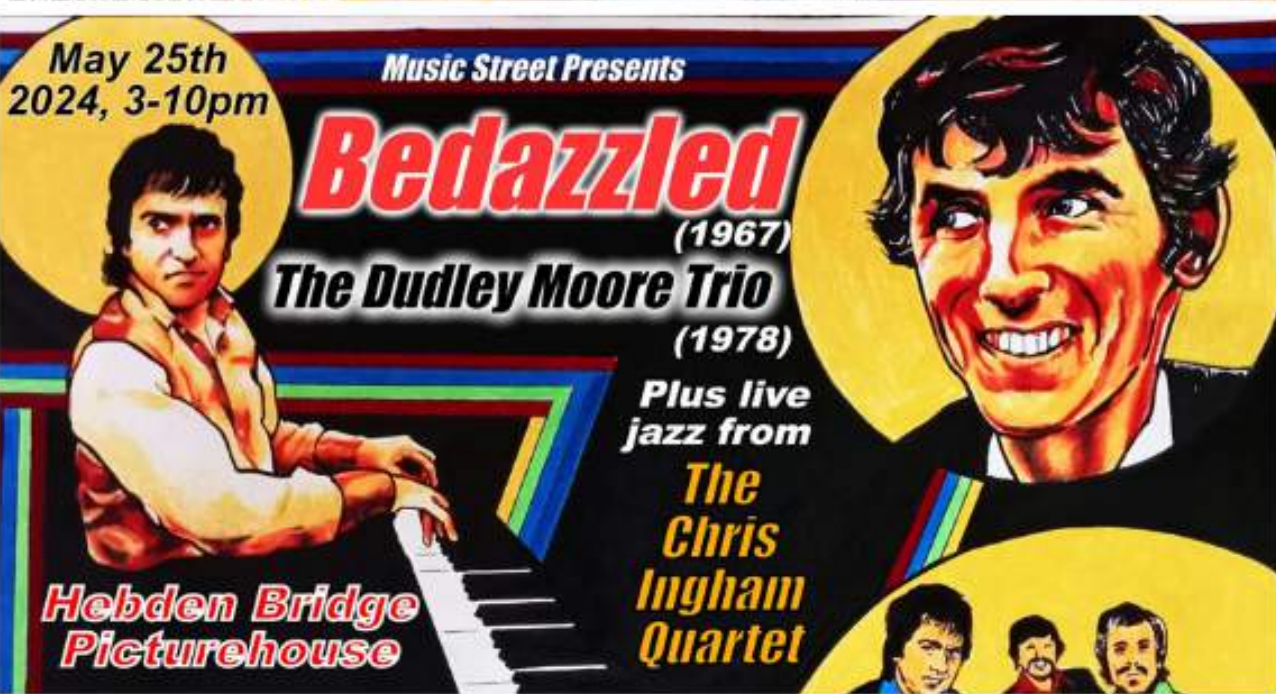
What if everything you believed as a kid was real?

THE FALL GUY (12A)

Colt Seavers (Oscar® nominee Ryan Gosling – Barbie, Drive) is a battle-scarred stuntman who, having left the business a year earlier to focus on both his physical and mental health, is drafted back into service when the star of a mega-budget studio movie – being directed by his ex, Jody Moreno (Emily Blunt, Oppenheimer, A Quiet Place) – goes missing.

THE HUDSUCKER PROXY (PG)

Paul Newman, Tim Robbins and Jennifer Jason Leigh star in Joel and Ethan Coen's darkly comic look at big business. When the founder of Hudsucker Industries leaps to his death from the 44th floor boardroom window, the board of directors panics. But there is a plan: install a complete imbecile as president of the company and devalue the stock so the board can acquire a controlling interest for themselves.



ELAHA (15)

Elaha is a young Kurdish-German woman facing a dilemma just weeks away from her wedding. Torn between the unconditional love for her family and her own aspirations in life, Elaha investigates the possibility of hymen reconstruction to cover up the fact that she is no longer a virgin – a state of 'honour' considered essential by her German-Kurdish community and, more specifically, by her strict mother.

THE GARFIELD MOVIE (U)

LOVE LIES BLEEDING (15)

From director Rose Glass comes an electric new romantic thriller, Love Lies Bleeding. A love story about reclusive gym manager Lou (Kristen Stewart), who falls hard for Jackie (Katy O'Brian), an ambitious bodybuilder. Jackie is working out at Lou's gym while she is passing through town en route to Vegas for a competition in pursuit of her dream. But their love leads to violence, as they are pulled deep into the web of Lou's criminal family.



LA CHIMERA (15)

Josh O'Connor excels as Arthur, a grief-stricken Englishman recently released from prison and adrift in Italy. He joins a group of grave-robbers seeking Etruscan artefacts, hoping riches will change his life. But then he finds himself drawn to Italia, a former maid to his dead girlfriend's mother.



THE CROW (18) - 30TH ANNIVERSARY

Starring Brandon Lee in his tragic final performance, this visually stunning smash hit follows a young musician brutally murdered alongside his fiancée, only to be risen from the grave by a mysterious crow. Seeking revenge, he battles a criminal underground that must answer for its crimes.



MUCH ADO ABOUT DYING (15) WITH DIR. Q&A

Filmmaker Simon finds his life drastically interrupted when he is called back to London from India to care for his retired bohemian gay actor Uncle David. Everything that could go wrong does go wrong. This screening will be followed by a Q&A with director Simon Chambers. In partnership with Pushing Up Daisies, which offers regular opportunities for community conversations on death and dying in open, respectful and friendly spaces.



NEZOUH (12A)

14-year-old Zeina and her family are the last to have stayed in their besieged hometown of Damascus in Syria. A missile rips a giant hole in their home, exposing them to the outside world. When a rope is mysteriously lowered into the hole, Zeina gets her first taste of freedom, and an unimaginable world of possibility opens up for her.
