KENSUKE'S KINGDOM (PG)

Young Michael and his family leave home to travel the world by boat. During a storm, he is thrown overboard and washed up on an island where he must adapt to life alone. But over time, he feels another presence, learning that this world is home to both danger and beauty beyond his imagination. Featuring the voice acting talents of Cillian Murphy, Sally Hawkins, Raffey Cassidy and Ken Watanabe.



SPIDER-MAN (12A)

Average teenager Peter Parker is transformed into an extraordinary super hero after he is accidentally bitten by a radioactive spider. When his beloved uncle is savagely murdered during a robbery, young Peter vows to use his powers to avenge his death.



THELMA (12A)

HAROLD AND THE PURPLE CRAYON (PG)
