

# WELCOME TO THE PICTURE HOUSE



The Picture House is a single screen cinema built in 1921 and seating over 500, showing mainstream, art-house, family, classic and foreign language films and broadcasting live theatre, music, opera and ballet on to the big screen. We're open every evening, weekend afternoons, Thursday mornings and for matinees during the school holidays. We have a kiosk and bar serving hot, cold and alcoholic drinks, sweet and savoury snacks, ice creams, cakes and popcorn – cash only please. Please do not bring your own food and drink into the cinema.

## ACCESSIBILITY

We are wheelchair accessible; access is via a ramp to the right hand (park) side of the building, using a RADAR key or calling 01422 842807 to alert a staff member to gain admission. An accessible toilet is located in the foyer (accessed via the auditorium). We have 4 wheelchair spaces within the seating area on sloping floor and 6 level floor wheelchair spaces at the rear of the stalls. For the hearing impaired we have headsets to give amplification and we aim to screen at least one film a week with subtitles on screen (subject to availability). For the visually impaired audio description is offered through audio headsets. Subtitled screenings and audio described films are listed overleaf with S/T and A/D.

## LOCATION & PARKING



We're located in the centre of town on the A646 (Halifax to Burnley road) close to many bus stops and 5 minutes' walk from the railway station.

There is no customer parking at the cinema, but on street parking is available nearby and the town has many pay and display car parks. We have one disabled parking space which customers may use when it is available.

But they must also contend with a family of criminals, who seek the treasure for themselves.

Charlize Theron and Seth Rogen shine in Long Shot, a very sweet, very funny, critically acclaimed romantic comedy that generates considerable tenderness from its odd couple premise. Secretary of State Charlotte (Theron) used to be Fred's (Rogen) babysitter. When they unexpectedly reconnect, the scruffy, self-deprecating journalist charms her with his memories of her youthful idealism, and as Charlotte prepares to run for President (to replace a terrible incumbent – satirically played by Bob Odenkirk), she impulsively hires him as her speechwriter. Fred is unprepared for her public lifestyle, but sparks fly as their chemistry – and a series of unexpected incidents – leads to romance.

Natalie Portman is sensational in Brady Corbet's (The Childhood of a Leader) Vox Lux. Part commentary on American celebrity culture, part review of the country's recent history, it starts in 1999, with teenager Celeste (Raffey Cassidy), a survivor of a high school shooting, singing at a memorial for her classmates and capturing the attention of a manager (Jude Law), who sets her on the path to fame. Years later, Celeste (Portman) has become a global superstar, but so jaded by the music business that she is now an entirely different animal; a hard-nosed 21st century brand. With a magnificent score from the late Scott Walker, plus songs by Sia and narration by Willem Dafoe.



### STYX (12A) Mon 3rd & Weds 5th June

From its opening scenes, Wolfgang Fischer's taut thriller Styx captivates the viewer with an overarching tension. Emergency doctor Rieke (Susanne Wolff) is sailing alone from Gibraltar to Ascension Island in the Atlantic, when she encounters a damaged boat overloaded with desperate refugees. Stricken by their plight, she tries her best to help them, but as the situation worsens, is forced to make a fateful decision. A provocative allegory of personal responsibility in the face of the migrant crisis, Styx explores themes of racism and empathy, western privilege and moral responsibility and is one of this year's most gripping dramas.
