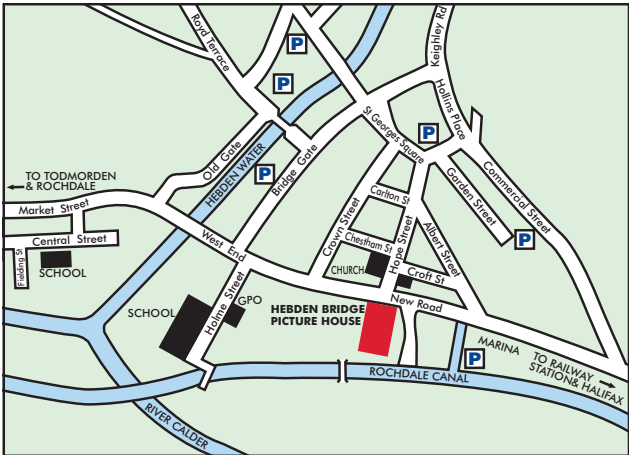

When Tim meets Mary (McAdams), they fall in love, but an unfortunate time-travel incident means they must meet for the first time again and again, as he tries to win her heart, he discovers that making the most of life may not need time travel at all.
