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PADDINGTON IN PERU (PG)

Paddington in Peru brings Paddington back home to the Peruvian jungle to visit his beloved Aunt Lucy, now a resident at the Home for Retired Bears. With the Brown Family and Mrs Bird in tow, a thrilling adventure ensues when a mysterious disappearance plunges them into an unexpected journey from the Amazon rainforest to the mountain peaks of Peru. Directed by Dougal Wilson and featuring the voice of Ben Whishaw as Paddington, the film blends live-action and animation to deliver another magical, feel-good cinematic experience.

SMALL THINGS LIKE THESE (12A)

Oscar-winner Cillian Murphy delivers a stunning performance as devoted father Bill Furlong in this Irish gem based on the best-selling novel of the same name by Claire Keegan (author of Foster, adapted as The Quiet Girl).

THE ROOM NEXT DOOR (12A)




TIMESTALKER (15)
